#### Sign up for our Listserv

What is a listserv, and why would I want to use one?

A listserv is an email application in which a sender (Lincoln School) can send one email to a whole group of people at one time. People that wish to receive the email need to subscribe to the list. The Lincoln listservs have been created to increase communication through email, and have provided a means for students, staff and parents to receive information about the school. You can subscribe to receive information, and un-subscribe when you change addresses or do not wish to receive the emails anymore.

Lincoln Elementary school has 8 different listservs and you can sign up for one or all of them. There is one for school communications and one for each of the grade levels (K - 6). A form has been provided for you to subscribe or unsubscribe. You are responsible for making sure your email is entered correctly.

To subscribe, go to the Lincoln Elementary School website:

<u>http://www.watertown.k12.sd.us/schools/elem/lincoln/index.htm</u> Once there, in the blue banner are a set of links. Click on the listserv link. Once you get to the listserv page, choose the grade level you would like to join, and click on that link. That will take you to a forms page (<u>http://www.watertown.k12.sd.us/schools/elem/lincoln/</u> <u>List\_Serve.htm</u>) that will allow you to place your name, email address, and subscribe. The same page will allow you to unsubscribe, should you choose to do so.

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Once you subscribe, you will receive an email from the K12 Data Center telling you your application has been received. The Lincoln School then must approve your application, then you will be able to receive emails with timely updates about the school at grade level, or at the all student level throughout the year. You can only receive emails from this list, not send. Please enjoy our communications!
