IS MY CHILD TOO SICK TO GO TO SCHOOL?

Parents are often faced with this decision when their child complains of not feeling well. These guidelines will be helpful to you. Consult your doctor for specific medical advice.

Fever - 100 degrees or higher - A fever is a sign of illness. The child should be free of fever for 24 hours before returning to school.

Sore Throat/Colds/Cough - Minor cold symptoms shouldn't interfere with your child attending school. A frequent cough and/or constant thick nasal drainage is a sign that your child might be contagious and more comfortable at home.

Rash - A rash may cover the entire body or only one area. If the rash is draining, has open areas or is causing the child to itch excessively your child should not attend school. They should also stay home for a rash that is accompanied by other symptoms like fever, sore throat, irritability, or vomiting.

Be sure to click on Lincoln School prior to purchase. *Vomiting/Diarrhea* - A child who has vomited should wait 24 hours and be able to retain solid food before returning to school. A child with frequent diarrhea should not go to school.

Sign up for our Listserv

What is a listserv, and why would I want to use one?

A listserv is an email application in which a sender (Lincoln School) can send one email to a whole group of people at one time. People that wish to receive the email need to subscribe to the list. The Lincoln listservs have been created to increase communication through email, and have provided a means for students, staff and parents to receive information about the school. You can subscribe to receive information, and un-subscribe when you change addresses or do not wish to receive the emails anymore.

Lincoln Elementary school has 8 different listservs and you can sign up for one or all of them. There is one for school communications and one for each of the grade levels (K - 6). A form has been provided for you to subscribe or unsubscribe. You are responsible for making sure your email is entered correctly.

To subscribe, go to the Lincoln Elementary School website:

Once you get to the listserv page, choose the grade level you would like to join, and click on that link. That will take you to a forms page (<u>http://www.watertown.k12.sd.us/schools/elem/lincoln/</u> <u>List_Serve.htm</u>) that will allow you to place your name, email address, and subscribe. The same page will allow you to unsubscribe, should you choose to do so.
